**\$67 Includes motor coach, tour guide, lunch, admission & tax.**

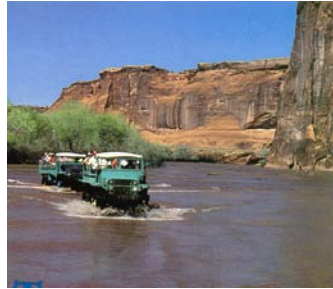


Our first stop today will be in the Village of Chimayo, north of Santa Fe. This village is home to many families who are the descendants of the Spanish settlers that arrived in the late 1500's. We'll visit El Santuario de Chimayo, a church known for its healing earth. And we'll visit a weaving shop that uses the simplistic Spanish loom, unchanged for hundreds of years. After a traditional New Mexican lunch we'll continue to Santa Fe. A visit to New Mexico is not complete without experiencing the capital city of Santa Fe, with its unusual charm and historical significance. This unique community offers wonderful, eclectic shops and history is everywhere. After an orientation tour of the Plaza area there will be approx. 3 hours of free time. The Plaza walking tour includes admission to Loretto Chapel Museum, famous for its miraculous staircase.

**Friday, Oct. 8:** 9AM gather in the lobby of the Hotel Albuquerque at Old Town for immediate departure. The day will be filled with interesting information and anecdotes to pass the time as we enjoy the journey into Indian Country. We will stop at El Rancho: the home of the movie stars, in Gallup and we'll stop to view Window Rock as we enter Arizona and stop again at Hubbell Trading Post in Ganado (terrific rug room, pictured above). We'll arrive at the Thunderbird Lodge in Chinle and enjoy dinner at the Thunderbird Cafeteria. The moon sets early tonight – great for star gazing! Meals included: none.

**Saturday, Oct. 9** After breakfast @ T-Bird Café, we'll load up for the morning jeep tour with a Navajo driver/guide! The 3½ tour takes us deep into the canyon to view petroglyphs, cliff dwellings and even a place to go shopping! We'll grab lunch to-go from our favorite cafeteria and we're on the road to Utah. The buttes and mesas of Monument Valley are fantastic to see in person. We'll travel by jeep with a Navajo guide once more past the Three Sisters to John Ford's Point and we'll see Snoopy, the Chief the Hub and you're sure to be inspired to make some names for the features you see in the rocks. A special visit to the Hogan of a treasured Diné weaver is a highlight. Bring layers of clothing on this tour, as the sun sets we'll enjoy a cookout dinner in Monument Valley! Meals included: cookout in Monument Valley



**Sunday, Oct. 10** We'll work our way back to 'Burque today, but not before we pack in lots more scenery and visits with Navajo weavers and trading posts. The Highlight is: Toadlena Trading Post with a traditional Navajo lunch cooked by the weavers! We'll have a farewell dinner of fajitas in Cuba, NM before arriving at our hotel in Albuquerque for the night. The hotel is located at the Sunport and their shuttle will transport you on Monday at your desired time.

Meals included: Breakfast, Lunch, Dinner. Breakfast is included Monday morning.

Journey well and may your memories of this weekend draw you back to Dinétah (Navajo land) again soon!
